Cronulla Years Ten and Twelve Fieldwork Excursion

The Year Ten and Year Twelve students undertook their Geography field work investigation on Thursday 23 February, at Cronulla coastal dunes ecosystem. Both the year groups completed their fieldwork methodologies such as sketches, transects, observations and recording with the assistance of Mr. Rajab, Miss. Ech and Mr. Nand.

The day started off with academic pursuits such as understanding the impact of the elements of weather and human impacts on the sand dunes ecosystem. Students then investigated the management strategies implemented by the local government and volunteer groups such as coastal care.

Students will now proceed to use their fieldwork data, class notes and their own learning from independent research to complete an assessment of learning which carries a significant weighting in their semester one academic achievements.

The excursion was a fun day of learning for both the students and teachers alike.

From Wednesday December 14 to Saturday 17 2016 - a group of twenty-one students from Years Seven and Eight embarked on a *Leaders and Mentors* camp. They went to Cataract Scout Park with Al Amanah College Imam-Sheikh Amr Alshelh and Al Amanah College welfare officer- Sheikh Chadi Kassem. Mindful Eating

It is not uncommon these days to be constantly grazing on food without taking time to enjoy a full meal – it is definitely not mindful eating. Often prepackaged, these convenience foods are lacking in nutrients linked to increased risk of diet related diseases. Being time poor, more of us are eating on the run, or in front of our computers or televisions – and often when we are not hungry.

Instead, we should be choosing to eat mindfully; brining our attention and focus to the present moment. Practising mindful eating can help to bring back an appreciation and enjoyment of food.

1. Sit at the dinner table for your meal

It is important to pay attention while eating, rather than grazing mindlessly. Put the phone down, log off your computer, turn off the television and enjoy your food. That way, you will be less likely to overeat. Take the time to talk to family members about their lives and have a conversation. A meal should be a positive and enjoyable time for all.

2. Rate your hunger level

If your child says she/he is hungry, ask them to rate her/his hunger level on a scale of one to ten with one being very hungry, five being satisfied and ten being so full that they feel sick. Do this throughout the meal and if they are not hungry, do not force them to eat a whole meal. If your child is hungry, they will keep eating. Encourage them to stop eating once they rate their hunger as five and not to keep eating until they reach level ten.

3. Let kids serve themselves

If your child is old enough, allow them to serve themselves

how much they would like to eat. While you can provide guidance so that they have enough veggies on their plate, allow them to decide how much will fill them up.

4. Encourage slow eating

Set the pace for the meal by eating slowly yourself. Take time to chew food properly and put your cutlery down before each mouthful. Aim to take at least twenty to thirty minutes to finish eating your meal. Make this a rule so your children know they will be sitting there for thirty minutes so they might as well eat their food slowly instead of rushing off to see what is on television or check their phones.

5. Discuss the food

At the dinner table, discuss how much you like or dislike a certain food. Ask your child to describe the taste or texture and if they do not like it, encourage them to explain why that is the case.

6. Make nutritious snacks easy to access

By having fruits in bowls on your kitchen bench or vegetable sticks cut up and in the fridge, your child is more likely to eat these foods. Stock your pantry and fridge with nutritious snacks.

7. Do not buy "occasional" items

By having confectionery, chips and other less nutritious items in the house, you just have to keep saying 'no' when they ask for these foods. Avoid buying these foods at the supermarket, it will be easier to say "no" in the supermarket once, than have to say it a numerous times if you bring the product home.
