YR 1 SYDNEY OBSERVATORY EXCURSION

On Tuesday 24 October, Year One explored the field of meteorology at the Sydney Observatory. During their tour, students were able to utilise a range of scientific instruments such as anemometers, thermometers and an okta to measure temperature, cloud cover, wind speed and direction. Students were also given an opportunity to partake in the launch of a water-powered rocket similar to those which carry satellites into space. By the end of the day, students were equipped with the knowledge to understand, interpret, observe and predict the Earth's atmosphere and phenomena.
