

الذِّي يرضِي بما يرضاهِ القرءان ويتأدب بآدابه ويتخلق بأخلاقه ويلتزم أوامره ولا يغضب لنفسه إلا إذا ارتكبت محارم الله.

الحِمْدُ للّهِ ربِّ العالمينَ لهُ النِّعمةُ وله الفضلُ ولهُ تعالى: (وإنَّكَ لَعَلَى خُلُقٍ عَظِيمٍ) سورة القلم / 4. وعن الثَّناءُ الحسنَ صلواتُ اللهِ الْبَرِّ الرحيمِ والمَلائِكةِ عائشة رضِّي الله عنها قَالَت عَبِدُما سُئلت عن خُلُق رسولَ الْمُقرَّبِينَ على سَيِّدِنَا مُخَمَّدٍ أَشْرِفِ المُرسليَنَ. الله صلى الله عليه وسلم: "فإنَّ خُلُقَ رسول الله صلى الله عليه وسلم كان القرءان" رواه مسلم في الصحيح.

أما أخبار كرمه وسحائه فعديدة منها ما رواه مسلم عن أنس رضِّي الله عنه أنه قال: "مَا سُئلِ رسُولِ الله صِلَى اللهِ عليةٍ وسلم على الإسلام شيئًا إلَّا أَعِطَاه، فأتاه رجل فسأله، فأمر له بغنم بين جبلين، فأتى قومه فقًال: أسلموا، فإن محمدًا يعطي عطاء من لا يخاف الفاق".

آلذي شع فيه نور النبي محمد عليه الصلاة أما أخبار زهده وتواضعه واختياره الدار الآخرة فكثيرة منها ما والسلام، ففي الثاني عشر من شهر ربيع الأول رواه البيهقي والترمذي وابن ماحه عن عبد الله أنه قالٍ: اَضَطجع النبي صلَى الله عليه وسلم على حصير فأثر الحصير بجلدِه، فجعلتُ أمسحه عنه وأقول بأبي أنت وأمي يا رسول الله، ألا أذِنتنا فنبسط لك شيئًا يقيك منه تنام عليه، فقال: "ما لي وللدنيا، وما أنا والدنيا، إنما أنا والدنيا ثم راح وترکها". كراكب استظل تحت شجرة

فقد كان صلى الله عليه وسلم متصفًا بصفات حسنة من الصدق، والأمانة، والصُلة، والعُفاف، والكرم، والشجاعة، وطاعة الله في كل حال وأوان ولحظة ونفس، مع الفصاحة الباهرة والنصح التام، والرأفة والرحِمة، والشفقة هو محمد الذي جعل الله خُلُقَه القرءان، هو محمد والإحسان، ومواساة الفقراء والأيتام والأرامل والضعفاء، وَكأن صلى الله عليه وسُلم أشد ألناًسُ تواضِّعًا، يحب المساكين ويشهد جنائزهم، ويعود مرضاهم، هذا كله مع حسن ِ السَّمت والصورة، والنسب العظيم، قال الله تعالى: (اللهُ أَعْلَمُ حَيْثُ يَجْعَلُ رِسَالَتَهُ) سورة الأنعام / 124. مُحَمَّدٌ تَجِنُ إليهِ الأَفِئدةُ وتقر بِهِ العيونُ وتأنِسُ بهِ القلوبُ، فَكلامُهُ نُورٌ وَ مَدْخَلُهُ نورٌ وَمخرَجُهُ نورٌ وَعَمَلُهُ نورٍ، إن سَكَتَ علاه الوُقَّارُ وإن نطِّقَ أخذ بالْقَلُوبوالبصائرُ والأبصار.

ومن أشهر هذه الكتب المدسوسة الكتاب المسمى مولد العروس الذي قيل فيه إن الله قبض قبضة من نور وجهه فقال لها كوني محمدًا فكانت محمدًا، وفي هذه العبارة نسبة الجَزئية لله تعالى وهو تباركَ وتعالى منزه عن الجزئية والانحلال. قال تعالى: (لَمْ يَلِدْ وَلَمْ يُولَدْ) الإخلاص / 3.

فهو لا يقبل التعدد والكثرة ولا التجزء والانقسام والله منزّه عن ذلك لًا يشبه شيئا من خلقه ولاً يَشبِهِه بِشَىءَ من خلقه:(لَيسَ كَمِثْلِهِ ۖ شَىءٌ وَهُوَ السَّمِيعُ البَصِيرُ) الشوري / 11.

ِوهذا الكتاب المسمى مولد العروس ليس من تأليف ابن الجوزي لأن ابن الجوزي من كبار علماء أهل السُنَّة والجَّماعة عقيدته أَنَّ الله ليس جسمًا كثيفًا يجس باليد كالشجر والحجر والبشر وليس جسمًا لطيفًا لا يجس باليد حتى يضبط كالضوء والظلام والريح ولا يوصف بصفات الأحسام كالحركة والسكون.

فواظبوا على حضور مجالس علم الدين والزموا أحكام دين الله تعالى تكونوا حقيقة ممن يتبعون الرسول النبي الأمي الاتباع الصحيح الكامل، أما مجرد حفظ الأناشيد وتوزيع الحلوى والأطعمة ونشر الزينة هنا وهناك من غير أداء الواجبات واحتناب المحرمات فهذا لا يرضاه رسول الله صلى الله عليه وسلم إنما الذي يحبه رسول الله صلى الله عليه وسلم لنا أن نؤدي الواجبات ونجتنب المحرمات التي نهى الله عنها، وإظهار هذه الشعائر مجردًا عن أداء الواجبات واجتناب المحرمات لا يُغني، بل لا بد من أداء الواجبات واجتناب المحرمات، فلسنا نقرّ الطائفة الوهابية التي تُحرّم على المسلمين الاحتفال بمولد النبي صلى الله عليه وسلم ومع ذلك لا نقرّ أولئك المطربين الذين ينشدون ويطربون الناس بأصواتهم ولا يؤدون الواجبات ويجتنبون المحرمات فاتّباع النبي صلى الله عليه وسلم يكون بأداء المحرمات. واجتناب الواجبات

Water - Drink of Choice!

Did you know?

Children and teenagers who regularly drink soft drinks and other sweetened drinks are more likely to be overweight.

In NSW, 55% of boys and 46% of girls in Year Six drink more than one cup of soft drink a week. By Year Eight, these figures rise to 68% of boys and 50% of girls.

Water

Drinking water is the best way to quench your thirst. Even better, it does not come with all the sugar and energy (kilojoules) found in fruit juice drinks, soft drinks, sports drinks and flavoured mineral waters.

Drinking water instead of sweetened drinks also prevents dental problems, while the fluoride found in tap water can help strengthen teeth and bones. Ideas to help you to drink more water

- Pack a water bottle whenever you go out.
- In summer, pack a frozen water bottle in your child's lunch box.
- Do not keep sweetened drinks at home; make cold water available instead.
- Water down sweetened drinks such as cordials or fruit juice - for a short time and then start to replace them with plain water.
- When playing sport, encourage kids to drink water rather than sports drinks or energy drinks.
- Serve plain water in decorative jugs.
 Add slices of lemon, orange or mint

for flavour and, in summer, add ice cubes to keep it chilled.

 Serve sweetened drinks in smaller glasses and only have them occasionally - not every day.

Milk

Milk is a nutritious drink for kids and teens and a great source of calcium, which is important for growing strong bones and teeth.

From two years of age, children should drink reduced fat milk. It contains much the same nutrients as full cream milk but is lower in unhealthy saturated fats and lower in energy (kilojoules).

Children under two years of age should not drink reduced fat milks as they need the extra energy (kilojoules) for their growth and development.

Fruit juice

Giving kids and teens whole fruit to eat is a better choice than offering fruit juice to

While whole fruit contains some natural sugars, which make it taste sweet, it also has lots of vitamins, minerals and fibre, which makes it more filling and nutritious than a glass of fruit juice.

One small glass of juice provides a child's recommended daily amount of vitamin C. Unfortunately, many children regularly drink large amounts of juice and this can contribute to them putting on excess weight.

Sweetened drinks: soft drinks, cordials and sports drinks

Soft drinks, cordials, sports drinks and flavoured mineral waters often have large amounts of sugar and kilojoules. In fact, a can of soft drink contains around ten teaspoons of sugar.

Drinking too many sweetened drinks can cause a range of problems including tooth decay, poor appetite, picky eating, change in bowel habits and putting on excess weight. These drinks should only be consumed occasionally - not every day.

Remember:

- Choose water as a drink and eat fruit.
- Sweetened drinks such as soft drinks, fruit juice drinks, cordials, sports and energy drinks are not a necessary part of a healthy diet.
- Regularly offering sweetened drinks makes it harder to choose water as a drink.
- If sweetened drinks are on the menu, try not to include them every day and choose healthier options, such as watered-down versions of favourite drinks. These will still quench your thirst, but without the excess sugar and kilojoules. It can also help reduce the preference for strongly sweetened drinks.
