PARENT HOLIDAY TIP

Benefits of an Evening Routine

Routines can take a bit of a siesta around now, so these ideas may be worth considering for a great start to 2019.

Keeping a regular routine is important for a lot of things, including for health reasons. Similarly, the Harvard Graduate School of Education has published a blog outlining how a predictable evening routine on school days can help create quality family time.

Here are some suggestions for parents, based on a two-hour routine:

- Begin by spending five to ten minutes discussing the day.
- Have children take out their homework, guide them in making a list of assignments, and ensure they have the supplies necessary to complete them.
- Eat dinner as a family; use conversation starters, such

as ‘Would you rather live in the future or the past?’ to encourage table talk. Encourage good table manners; give thanks for the good things in your lives.

- Sit with the children as they complete their homework to ensure it gets done thoroughly.
- Allow 30 minutes for a bedtime routine, including reading with the children.

Now not all these are doable in our busy lives, but they are certainly worth thinking about.


