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PARENT GUIDELINES

The School will continue to implement its risk management strategies around the interactions between staff members and parents. Face to face interactions will be limited to where social distancing can be exercised with a preference being for phone or online contact between parents and the school.

Parents are requested to exercise social distancing when attending the school's office and during pick up and drop off routines. Gatherings of parents before and after school will not be allowed.

Parents are requested not to send their children who are sick with a fever, cough, temperature or any form of sickness to school.

Child(ren) will be sent home if they are displaying cold or flu symptoms. These students are being asked to provide a medical clearance certificate before returning to school

Parents are requested to promote and model good hygiene with their children at home.

DROP OFF/ COLLECTING STUDENTS

Parents are kindly requested to park their vehicles and accompany their child into the school grounds. Please do not obstruct traffic by double parking or stopping anywhere near the entrance gates. You must collect your children from their classroom.

LOST PROPERTY

Make sure that all school items and clothing are clearly labelled with name, class and school.

Students are not to bring valuable items to school, as the school will not be held responsible for any lost items.

If something has been lost, ask about the item at the front office.

All families who have an email address registered on the school's system should have received an email containing a username and password that you can use to log in to our school parent portal igloo. 














INITIALIT

This year at Al Amanah College, Kindergarten have started a new literacy program called InitiaLit. InitiaLit is a promising and evidence-based whole-class program providing all children with the essential core knowledge and strong foundations to become successful readers and writers. This literacy program is also a three-year program, covering the first three years of school (Kindergarten/Foundation to Year 2).

The aim of the InitiaLit program is to address initial instruction in the hope that fewer children will fall behind and require more intensive intervention.

Although we have been disadvantaged with the pandemic, we are still quite impressed with the progress of Kindergarten students so far. Many of them are already reading words and short sentences. We are hoping that all the Kindy students will be fluently reading by the end of the year!


MATH MASTERY

Mastery in Mathematics is a journey and long-term goal that is achieved through exploration, clarification, practice and application over time. This year, Al Amanah College began the Math Mastery Series to instil fluency and automaticity in fundamental maths skills. This is a Direct Instruction Maths Program that has been especially designed for the contemporary Australian classroom.

Maths Mastery consists of daily lessons composed of strands each starting at base level.

At our school, students in Years 3 – 6 use this program 3 times a week as a part of their Mathematic lessons. The teachers have observed students enjoying some of the challenging questions and tracking their progress. We hope that through implementation of the skills and knowledge that is gained through the Math Mastery program, students' academic levels will be elevated.

READING YOUR CHILD'S REPORT

Could try harder . . . always does her best . . . lacks concentration . . . can be distracted . . . a pleasure to teach . .

Do these comments, taken from a batch of student reports sound familiar?

Student reports bring mixed feelings for parents/carers. Pleasure and pride if they are performing well but considerable angst when children are not progressing as you hoped.

Reports can sometimes mean anxious times for children too. Will my parents/carers be disappointed or proud?

Kids of all ages take their cues from their parents/carers, so your reaction to their school report can affect the way they see themselves as learners and as people.

Before you rip open the sealed envelope containing the report do a little self-check to see if you are in the right frame of mind:

1. Are your expectations for your son or daughter realistic and in line with their ability?

Expectations are tricky. If they are too high then kids can be turned off learning. Too low and there is nothing to strive for. Pitch your expectations in line with your child's abilities. A quick check of your child's last report cards may provide you with a good yardstick.

- 2. Do you believe that children learn at different rates? There are slow bloomers, late developers and steady-as-you-go kids in every classroom, so avoid comparing your child to siblings, your friends' children and even yourself when you were a child. Instead look for individual progress.
- 3. Are you willing to safeguard your child's self-esteem rather than deflate it?

Self-confidence is a pre-requisite for learning, so be prepared to be as positive and encouraging as possible. School reports come in different formats. Some are prescriptive while some use grading systems such as A, B, C, etc. with room for teacher comments. Regardless of the format school reports should provide you with an idea of your child's progress in all subject areas, their attitude and social development.

Here are some ideas to consider when you open your child's report:

Focus on strengths. Do you look for strengths or weaknesses first? The challenge is to focus on strengths even if they are not in the traditional 3Rs or core subjects.

Take into account your child's effort and attitude to learning. If the report indicates that effort is below standard, then you have something to work on. If your child is putting in the required effort, then you cannot ask any more than that, regardless of the grading.

Broaden your focus away from academic performance to form a picture of your child's progress as a member of a social setting.

How your child gets along with his or her peers will influence his happiness and well-being, as well as give an indicator to his future

The skills of independence and co-operation are highly valued by employers so don't dismiss these as unimportant.

Take note of student self-assessment. Kids are generally very honest and will give a realistic assessment of their progress. They are generally very perceptive so take note of their opinions.

Discuss the report with your son or daughter talking about strengths first before looking at areas that need improvement. Ask for their opinion about how they performed and discuss their concerns.
