Freedoms for fully vaccinated people

Stay-at-home orders for adults who have received both doses of the COVID-19 vaccine were lifted on Monday 18 October 2021 after NSW passed the 80% double vaccination target. Here is the latest update for fully vaccinated people:-

Masks

- required in all indoor settings including public transport
- · no longer required in outdoor settings

Visiting family and friends

- up to 20 fully vaccinated visitors allowed in a home
- up to 50 people in outdoor gatherings
- visitors to hospitals, residents in aged care facilities and disability homes permitted

Exercise and recreation

- gyms, indoor recreation and sporting facilities reopen, up to 20 people in classes
- indoor swimming pools open
- community sports permitted

Shopping and personal services

non-critical retail reopen

Restaurants and hospitality

- hospitality venues reopen for up to 20 people per booking
- no singing indoors (except for performers)
- dancing permitted indoors and outdoors

Travel and transport

- 5km travel limit scrapped for Greater Sydney but no regional travel
- car pooling permitted

Roadmap to return to face-to-face learning

From 11 October stay-at-home orders have been lifted across NSW.

Schools will return to face-to-face learning either through a 'staged return' or 'full return' depending on NSW Health conditions in their area. All other schools will continue to operate on-site learning subject to ongoing NSW Health advice.

All schools in Greater Sydney (including the Blue Mountains and Wollongong), will return to face-to-face learning with NSW Health-approved COVID-safe settings on school sites in the following order:

- from 18 October department preschools, Kindergarten, Year 1
- from 25 October all remaining year groups.

Schools in the Wingecarribee local government area will return all cohorts to on-site learning on 11 October 2021.


Residential tenancy support

The Residential tenancy support package applies to eligible COVID-19 impacted tenants and landlords. It includes a freeze on evictions and assistance for landlords who reduce rent. A freeze on evictions means that from 14 July to 11 November 2021, tenants who are financially impacted by COVID-19 cannot be evicted if they cannot pay their rent in full.

In addition, the Residential Tenancy Support Payment of up to \$4,500 is available to help renters and their landlords meet rent payments. Claims can be made on the NSW Fair Trading website.

Please note, the online application process for claims up to \$4,500 will be available from 24 September 2021.
