


COVID-19 Major Clean-up - 30 October 2021

The school is actively ensuring all staff members are practising social distancing if attending school grounds and maintaining regular personal hygiene practices through providing hand sanitisers in each classroom and antibacterial hand soap dispensers near all designated hand basins on a daily basis, as well as abiding by online teaching guidelines and lockdown restrictions.

The school will still maintain its daily disinfection routine and major clean-ups as needed, to ensure the adoption of all reasonably practicable measures as well as reduce the spread of viruses or germs at our campuses.





This week, Year Four students conducted a hands-on experiment to experience how features of the landscapes change over time. The aim of the experiment was to investigate the effect of water erosion on the landscape through the use of a simple model, which consisted of sand, small rocks, and water. Students enthusiastically observed how the water flowed downwards, causing changes to the landscape.

Post-investigation, students evaluated the results and explained the effect of slope, rocks and volume of water on the amount of erosion.

Students were in absolute awe as they visualised erosion first-hand. Their fascination stimulated further discussion on how we can slow down the process of erosion in the future. Impressive strategies were shared!




Mrs Dabboussi then introduced the 2022 School Captains, Vice Captains and SRC members. Congratulations to the following students:





Backyard Tips for Parents

Children love to play and the backyard, courtyard or local park are great places to learn, explore, make up games and have fun. Backyard games can be inventive and encourage sustained concentration and application by kids.

Backyard games do not have to be complicated or expensive - a bit of chalk, a ball or a skipping rope can all get a game underway. Playing in the backyard also allows children to be noisy and messy, physically challenge themselves and move in ways that are not possible indoors.

Encouraging your kids to play is an important way you can support their health, coordination, self confidence and happiness.

Try these popular games

- Hide and seek
- Skipping
- Hopscotch
- Throwing and catching games, like knocking down a target
- Chasing games, like tag and stuck in the mud
- Racquet games against a wall
- French cricket or backyard cricket
- Running and jumping

Tips for backyard games

- Check your backyard, courtyard or park and remove or block off unsafe areas
- Let your children explore and make up their own activities and rules try not to interfere
- It is more fun if your child has a 'friend or two' (or you) to play with
- Focus on what your child can do, not what they can not
- Make active play fun and positive
- Be patient and provide plenty of time for your children to practise movements
- Be active with your children have fun and be a role model

Staying safe

- Slip, Slop Slap, Seek, Slide make sure your child wears sunscreen, sun glasses, clothing and a hat to protect him/her from the sun. Play in the shade when you can.
- Being active means children will need extra fluids, especially if it is hot and humid. Make sure they have regular drinks of water while they are playing.

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
