



Reminder to all parents Last Day of Term 3


Please be reminded that the last day for students is Thursday 22 September. Friday 23 September is a pupil free day.










SHOE LACE TYING WORKSHOP










SUPER STITCH CLUB










HAJ & HIJRI CELEBRATION














YEAR 1 EXCURSION



On Tuesday the 23rd of August Year One ventured to the Fairfield Museum. It all began in an 1800's classroom whereby students were seated on wooden rigid benches and desks. Their teach Mr Brock informed them that they will be completing some handwriting worksheets using an ink pen. Mr Brock always kept the students on track, reminding them of the ways in which children learned in the past through strict punishment.


Our next stop was the Caversham and Laundry. Upon entering the Caversham house, the students were amazed by artefacts from the past. It provided them with an insight into the living conditions during the Early 20th Century. After this we headed over to the laundry. Students were shown how clothes were cleaned in the past and the varying methods of drying clothes. Our instructor ensured that the students immersed themselves into the experience by getting them to hand the washing themselves. As a result, students were able to identify the type of chores children used to do.

Our next stop was the blacksmith. From the minute the students stepped into this dusty room their eyes were glued to the fire in front of them. The black smith explained to the students that he uses that fire to mould metal into useful objects. These objects were particularly useful in the past as they didn't have the technology we have now. He demonstrated his great skills by making a butcher's hook using a straight piece of metal.

The students were delighted by this demonstration and we even got to keep the hook as a class souvenir!

Finally, the students got to dress up in costumes to depict the different classes that existed in society. Overall, it was a very engaging and insightful experience for all students.










YEAR 4 EXCURSION










BOOK WEEK










YEAR 2 SEA LIFE

After the aquarium we were able to have lunch on the wharf as it was such a beautiful day! All students were on their best behaviour and had a fabulous time.














KINDY INCURSION










STAGE 3 GALA DAY




