



In Term 2 , students in Years 3 and 5, took part in the National Assessment Program — Literacy and Numeracy, or NAPLAN, as it is commonly known.

Skills that will were tested included: reading, writing, spelling, grammar and punctuation, and numeracy. These tests were completed at school and are considered just another part of the curriculum.

For the first time this ever, students completed part of the NAPLAN testing online. We are incredibly proud of our Year 3 and Year 5 for their excellent NAPLAN results this year. The assessments provide a snapshot of how students are performing against syllabus standards at one point in time. We are delighted that, once again the school has improved performance even further on previous years.

#### **Yr4 EXCURSION**





## 2MFM & DARULFATWA Excursion






#### Al Amanah Bankstown Campus Stage 2&3 Life Skills Program;
