

The ILSP programme was introduced in 2022 as an initiative to assist students who were disadvantaged throughout the COVID-19 lockdown period. Literacy and Numeracy classes were designed, exploring the core skills and knowledge students required to excel and improve their performance in their academic career.


Classrooms were designed to be small, to enable teachers to focus on each individual student's strengths and weaknesses. Sessions were held three days a week, two sessions each day, for a timeframe of forty-five minutes per session. This allowed teachers to explore all the necessities of the English and Mathematics subjects in an effective and efficient manner.

The ILSP programme valued the importance of feedback and ensured the programme was constantly adjusted to improve the effectiveness of the classroom. Feedback was taken from teachers, students as well as parents, to ensure everyone was satisfied with the structure of the programme and the style of learning.

This programme allowed students to receive the necessary resources and skills to perform in accordance with their year group expectations. Students explored literacy skills such as essay writing, discursive writing and the implementation of literacy techniques. Students also explored numeracy skills such as algebra, problem-solving and geometry. Students were assessed on the skills they learnt and the program was further adjusted accordingly.

Al Amanah College strives to ensure its students are supported and receive the skills they need throughout their schooling journey.



Our dedicated staff used evidence-informed approaches to enhance teaching and learning programme, assessments, and classroom practice. Primary school staff participated in PD sessions relating to the new English programme which ensured that all Kindy to Six teachers are familiar with the new English programme, as well as other Professional Development sessions related to Mathematics. Secondary school staff participated in a professional development session run by the AIS which focused on the importance of data collection and differentiation in informing teacher practice and faculty data plans. Presenters, Sandra and Carlo, ran informative sessions and activities regarding different types of data collection in the classroom, the importance of strategies for differentiating content, and effective pedagogical practices to improve teaching programmes and practice. The sessions were highly effective and informative and allowed teachers to properly reflect on how they can enhance teaching and learning.

We thank the AIS for providing this valuable Professional Development session which effectively helped us evaluate our pedagogy.

Senior Mentoring Programme

This year the Al Amanah Year Eleven students commenced the Peer mentoring programme. The programme aimed to facilitate effective time management and goal-setting for academic achievements by all students in high school. This programme was implemented three days a week during roll call.

An allocated team of Year Eleven students were assigned to a roll call class in the junior school (Years Seven to Ten cohorts). The senior students aimed to further assist students to develop clear strategies and a study timetable so they can work towards achieving their academic goals. At the end of each term, senior students assisted students in evaluating their goals and strategies. Students were encouraged to work collaboratively with the year advisors via email and during their free time to come up with suitable strategies for each roll call class. The teams developed beneficial resources to share among their classes.

In their design, students used their knowledge of circuits, lights, torches and materials to form a shadow instillation. All Vivid light instillations/shows told a story and students were very creative in displaying their projects.



- 1. Planning and successfully implementing a study regime over their summer break. It is recommended that Year Twelve students take leadership in formulating a plan to accommodate family and personal commitments whilst also making time for academic pursuits
- 2. In academic knowledge driven courses such as Business Studies, Biology, Economics, Geography and Chemistry it is vital that ample time is spent in readings to ensure preparations for the half yearly exams are well underway during the break. It is also essential that all syllabus concepts, skills and rubric requirements for these courses are clearly understood by all students.
- 3. In English, it would be advisable for all students to ensure all prescribed texts and rubric requirements are well understood. In Mathematics solving problems is key to success.
- 4. The use of past HSC exams for practice under time constraints is an excellent idea. Note the past exams and marking criteria/ guidelines are available on BOSTES website.
- 5. It is also advisable that all Year Twelve students access past Half Yearly Exams in the library and Moodle to practice writing responses to exam questions under time constraints. Please note students should feel free to send responses via email to their teachers to obtain feedback over the break.

Learning resources will continue to be available on Moodle and it is a great pathway to remain engaged with academic work. Mr Nand will continue to be available via email over the break in the event you have any queries regarding senior mentoring program work and or record keeping for university related applications in 2023.

Year Eleven Geography Excursion

On Wednesday the 9 November, the Year Eleven Geography class went on an excursion to Cronulla Beach, to measure the vulnerability and resilience of the ecosystem.

Students used devices such as a hygrometer and anemometer to test humidity, light intensity, wind speed and wind direction, as well as quadrats to look at species diversity. Furthermore, the students also analysed the types of dunes and compared different sites to identify how the four spheres interact, and the natural and human induced stresses on the ecosystem to discover its resilience and vulnerability.

This excursion also allowed the students to explore various plant species as well as their impact on the incipient dunes and foredunes. Moreover, the students also looked at the management strategies that have been implemented in Cronulla, and their effectiveness on the ecosystem.

Overall, this exciting experience gave the Geography students a thorough understanding of resilience and vulnerability of ecosystems.




