




Year Five History Excursion

Year Four Elizabeth Farm Excursion

On Wednesday 25 September, Year Four students visited Elizabeth Farm, where they were transported back in time! They were given the opportunity to experience life as a convict in the early 1800's.

Elizabeth Farm is one of the oldest homes in Australia, built in 1793 for John and Elizabeth Macarthur. The home was built by convicts who continued to work on the farm to maintain the home and gardens, take care of the animals and serve the Macarthur family. Students were able to dress up and experience a day in the life of a convict, working at Elizabeth Farm. They polished pots, swept the floors and ground spices in the kitchen and then set the table for dinner with fancy glassware and cutlery.

Students then explored the living room and

bedrooms in the home, before heading out to the garden, where they continued their duties by washing and hanging out the clothing and linen.

Year Four had a fabulous day! They thoroughly enjoyed the experience, which was a great way to consolidate their learning of content covered in History unit on British Colonisation!

Year Six Science Experiment - Electricity STEM Unit of Work

For Science, Year Six students had a go at experimenting and drawing their own simple circuit, including a bulb, a power source (Battery), and a switch in their workbook. Part of the challenge requires them to choose the appropriate components for the experiment.

Students compared their circuit diagram with others around them. Explained the difference between having an open and closed circuit; open circuit means the switch is turned off, therefore no flow of electrons; closed circuit means the switch is turned on, allowing for the electrons to flow throughout the circuit. Students drew a closed and open circuit in their science workbook.

At the end, students wrote a procedure and discussed and evaluated the ways in which they can change circuits by adding more batteries, more bulbs and longer wires. Initially, students predicted what they think will happen when making these alterations to a simple circuit, before revealing the answer. Students were very engaged and enjoyed the experiment.

Year Twelve First Aid Course

'You are driving down Speed Street to Al Amanah, you see a fatal car crash occur right in front of you. The casualty is unconscious with severe bleeding and there are no medical professionals around. You want to help, but what to do?'

On Wednesday 4 September 2019, Year Twelve students were given the opportunity as part of a six-hour lecture coupled with an informative pre-course theory, to delve into the procedures and steps needed to responsibly deal with such situation.

The Year Twelve students learnt in detail the DRS ABCD method: identification of danger, placing the casualty in a recovery position, sending for help, checking obstruction of casualty airway, breathing, performing CPR, and working a defibrillator. Other valuable knowledge included how to bandage an open wound, issue an Epipen and safely work with syringes.

A tiring, yet informative day, within a collaborative environment, the students fostered first aid knowledge to become future responsible citizens to deal with any situation.


Bankstown Children's Hospital Visit
