


2022 HSC Results

School Uniform

As a part of school policies, students are required to attend school with correct school uniform and proper haircuts. Teachers will be checking students' uniform every morning. Students found wearing incorrect uniform will be sent to the office and parents will be contacted and asked to either bring the correct uniform or take the student home. Students with inappropriate haircuts will be sent home.

Please ensure your labels all items of clothing. We have tubs of lost property on display in the office area. Many of the items are new and very costly. We have numerous items such as jumpers and hats. Please ask your child to check through lost property carefully.

School Hats - 'No hat, play under the shelter'

The time has come! The sun's intensity is building and we need to protect the children's skin once again. For those who need a new hat, please visit the office on Tuesday to purchase one.

Nut Aware School

We strive to be a 'nut-aware' environment in order to minimise risks to students. Staff members are trained to administer assistance when allergic reaction occurs. For some children, even the smallest trace of nut product can result in an allergic reaction. Please be careful with the food you send with your child/ren to school.

Attendance

It is important that your child arrives at school on time. Children like to have a few minutes before the day starts to do things such as catch up with their friends.

Morning assembly is held at 8:15am, all students are required to line up in their designated areas.

If a primary student arrives late (after 8:40am), he/she will need to get a late slip from the front office. Secondary students are to get a late slip (after 8:45am).

As the school is responsible for the welfare and safety of students, it is vital for us to know their whereabouts at all times. If parents wish to collect children during school hours, they must go to the office first to sign their children out of the school. Written permission is required from the parents or guardians for any other person to collect a child. Identification for person collecting the student must be sighted.

First Aid Course at Al Amanah College

At the end of last year 2022 the staff member attended, as part of development day, a first aid course. On Thursday 8 December CPR First Aid Australia, conducted the First Aid Course at Al Amanah College for the staff. The First Aid Course provided both teaching and non-teaching staff, with the nationally accredited qualification to be a First Aid representative in the school and other required situations.

The course delivered highly practical scenarios that focused on real life safety in which the participants could potentially put into practice during their duty of care. It was a requirement of the course that participants perform a minimum of two minutes of CPR using the DRABCD method on several mannequins that ranged form an infant, a child, and an adult that were placed on the floor with five cycles of both compression and ventilation. In addition, the participants examined various common allergic reactions and how to effectively administer an EpiPen in a potential anaphylactic situation and common or life-threatening injuries including nosebleeds, choking and burns.

The practical session coupled with the pre-course theory equipped the participants with sufficient training and knowledge which allowed them to confidently recognise and respond to emergencies using basic life support techniques.

After the successful completion of the course, each Al Amanah staff member was awarded and issued with a First Aid certificate.



2023 Staff Development Day Two - Principal Whole School Workshop





On the 30 January 2023, Al Amanah College primary and secondary schools teachers were welcomed back by the college Principal, Mr Ayman Alwan, in the Grand Hall. Mr Alwan welcomed the new teachers, and conducted a seminar on school policies and procedures, roles and responsibilities, and the child protection policy and procedures. The session also highlighted the accreditation process and the use of the platform 'Employment Hero'. During the session, Mr Alwan provided information about the importance of implementing school policies and procedures such as duty of care and expectations of staff performance reviews. The College and staff prioritise student wellbeing, as well as the importance of positive learning environments, and safety at all times, which was highlighted in the child protection policy and staff code of conduct sessions. Teachers engaged with these procedures through reading modules and completing quizzes on 'Employment Hero' and a principal led discussion amongst staff members.



Year Twelve Biology Excursion

On Thursday 16 February, Year Twelve Biology students attended a kick-starter at the University of Sydney which provided them with background knowledge on their current fifth module Heredity. The students were given the opportunity to conduct experiments learnt about in class, further extending their knowledge for the HSC Biology course.

At the beginning of the day, students attended the morning session of the kickstarter program, where they were given a worksheet to fill out along with experimental work with extracting DNA as well as learning about how to track a sickle cell disease using these methods. After the session, students were given a short prayer and lunch break.

During the second session, students examined plasmid DNA and DNA resistance alongside the difference between synthetic enzymes and natural enzymes and the effect that they hold on resistance. The students were able to participate in hands on experimentation and enjoyed the insight into these methods which were applicable in microbiology, microchemistry and the like.

On behalf the Year Twelve Biology class, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the school for giving us the opportunity to attend this highly beneficial kick -starter course at the University of Sydney.



COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE Information for parents and carers

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. Schools work in partnership with parents and carers to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

Legal responsibilities for **PARENTS AND CARERS**

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age. The Education Act 1990 requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school, or, are registered with NSW Education Standards Authority for home schooling.

Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

The importance of ARRIVING ON TIME

Arriving at school and class on time:

- Makes sure that students do not miss out on important learning activities early in the day
- Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- Give students time to spend time with their friends before class
- Reduces classroom disruption

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents or carers.



Absences FROM SCHOOL

Sometimes your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick, or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment during school hours
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstances (e.g. attending a funeral)

Following an absence, you must provide your child's school with an explanation of the absence within seven school days. However, the school may contact you to discuss the absence if they have not received an explanation from you within two days. Principals may decline to accept an explanation that you have provided if they do not believe the absence is in the best interest of your child. In these circumstances your child's absence would be recorded as unjustified. When this happens, the principal will let you know the reasons why they have made this decision.

The school may request medical certificates or other documentation when frequent or long-term absences are explained as being due to the child's illness. Principals may also seek parent's permission to speak with medical specialists to obtain information to collaboratively develop a health care plan to support your child. If the request is denied, the absences can be recorded as unjustified.

When your child has difficulties ATTENDING SCHOOL

You should contact the school as soon as possible to discuss the issue and ask for help. Strategies to help improve attendance may include a referral to support within the school or linking your child with appropriate external support networks.

The principal may seek your assistance to help develop an Attendance Improvement Plan that identifies the issues that prevent your child from attending school regularly and collaborates with you and your child to seek strategies to enable your child to get to school.

Consequences of CONTINUED ABSENCES

Some of the following actions may be undertaken:

Compulsory Schooling Conferences

You may be asked, along with your child, to attend a Compulsory Schooling Conference that is convened by a person authorised by the Secretary of the NSW Department of Education. The conference will help to identify the supports your child may need to have in place, so they attend school regularly. The school, parents and agencies will work together to develop an agreed plan (known as undertakings) to support your child's attendance at school.

The Compulsory Schooling Conference is the final school-based intervention that can be taken to address matters of unsatisfactory school attendance. It is important to understand that the school may refer the case to the Department of Education Legal Services to take further action where children of compulsory school age continue to have unacceptable unexplained or unjustified absences from school, despite attempted interventions at the school level.

Compulsory Schooling Order

If your child's attendance at school remains unsatisfactory the Department may apply to the Children's Court for a Compulsory Schooling Order. The Children's Court magistrate may order a Compulsory Schooling Conference to be convened.

Prosecution in the Local Court

School and Department legal staff remain committed to working in partnership with you to address the issues which are preventing your child's full participation at school. In circumstances where a breach of compulsory schooling orders occurs further action may be taken against a parent in the Local Court. The result of court action can be the imposition of a community service order or a fine.

Travel during

Families are encouraged to travel during school holidays. If travel during school term is necessary, discuss this with your child's school before the proposed period of travel. An Application for Extended Leave-Travel may need to be completed. Absences relating to travel will be marked as leave on the roll and will contribute to your child's total absences for the year.

In some circumstances students may be eligible to enrol in distance education for travel periods over 50 school days. This should be discussed with your child's school principal.



School LEAVING AGE

In New South Wales, students must complete Year 10 or its equivalent. After Year 10, and up until they reach 17 years of age, there are a range of flexible options for students to complete their schooling.

Working in PARTNERSHIP 🔫

Working collaboratively with students and their families is the best way to support the regular attendance of students at school. We look forward to working in partnership with you to support your child to fulfil their life opportunities.

Ten-Day Lunch Box Menu

Below are a few healthy lunch box ideas to inspire you year-round. We always recommend thinking of each lunch box in terms of the five food groups and making sure they're all represented:

- Dairy: the foods in this group are excellent sources of calcium, which is important for strong, healthy bones. Not many other foods in our diet contain as much calcium as dairy foods.
- Fruit: fruit provides vitamins, minerals, dietary fibre and many phytonutrients (nutrients naturally present in plants), that help your body stay healthy.
- Grain (cereal) foods: always choose whole grain and/or high fibre varieties of breads, cereals, rice, pasta, noodles, etc. Refined grain products (such as cakes or biscuits) can be high in added sugar, fat and sodium.
- Lean meats and poultry, fish, eggs, tofu, nuts and seeds: our body uses the protein we eat to make specialised chemicals such as haemoglobin and adrenalin. Protein also builds, maintains, and repairs the tissues in our body. Muscles and organs (such as your heart) are made of protein.
- Vegetables, legumes and beans: vegetables should make up a large part of your daily food intake and should be encouraged at every meal (including snack times). They provide vitamins, minerals, dietary fibre and phytonutrients (nutrients naturally present in plants) to help your body stay healthy.
