



As the year comes to a close, we wish all our students a wonderful holiday and the best of luck in the coming years.














Kindy to Year Five End-of-Year Presentation Ceremony Day 2024



- Planning and successfully implementing a study regime over their summer break. It is recommended that Year Twelve students
 take leadership in formulating a plan to accommodate family and personal commitments whilst also making time for academic
 pursuits.
- 2. In academic knowledge driven courses such as Business Studies, Biology, Economics, Geography and Chemistry it is vital that ample time is spent in readings to ensure preparations for the half yearly exams are well underway during the break. It is also essential that all syllabus concepts, skills and rubric requirements for these courses are clearly understood by all students.
- 3. In English, it would be advisable for all students to ensure all prescribed texts and rubric requirements are well understood. In Mathematics solving problems is key to success.
- 4. The use of past HSC exams for practise under time constraints is an excellent idea. Note the past exams and marking criteria/ guidelines are available on BOSTES website.
- 5. It is also advisable that all Year Twelve students access past Half Yearly Exams in the library and Moodle to practise writing responses to exam questions under time constraints. Please note students should feel free to send responses via email to their teachers to obtain feedback over the break.
- 6. If you are part of a study group for a certain subject then set up study session to study together. Study groups are effective for the purpose of motivation and peer assistance.
- 7. Do not isolate yourself from your peers and maintain resilience to complete readings especially in academic (content rich subjects).



In the swim for pool safety

As the weather warms up, more of us will go swimming in pools at home, friends' places or public pools. These are fun places but they can also be where illness spreads.

Some germs are not easily killed by chlorine. Swallowing even a small amount of contaminated pool water can cause diarrhoea and vomiting.

Here are some tips to help your family stay healthy when swimming in pools:

- Anyone who has been sick with diarrhoea in the past two weeks should avoid pools.
- Wash young children thoroughly (especially around the bottom) with soap and water before they swim.
- Older children and adults should be clean before swimming. Have a shower, if you can.
- · Change nappies away from the poolside.



- Take young children for regular toilet breaks to avoid accidents.
- Use disposable 'swimming' nappies, or add tight-fitting swimmers.
- Wash hands with soap and water after changing nappies, using the toilet and before eating.
